

REFLECTIONS

Simeon and Anna have been waiting expectantly for hope in a world where suffering has become a way of life. The hope they have been longing for is now before them in the Christ-child... but this does not mean the end of suffering. Instead, it seems that this child of hope will deal with the suffering by sharing it himself.

Paul picks up this theme in his letter which is a moving reflection on his own recent suffering and how it has deepened his faith. He is resolute that God is the God of all consolation, offering us consolation that we can in turn offer to others. For Paul, there is no such thing as an isolated individual. Consolation is given that it may be given away again, and the source of all comfort is God's own Self. We can take heart that there is nothing we will be asked to endure that God has not already sent Jesus to endure for us.

Going deeper

The word Paul uses for consolation is *paraklesis* which literally means a calling to one's aid. N.T. Wright says: "The whole idea of the word is that one person is being with another, speaking words which change their mood and situation, giving them courage, new hope, new direction, new insights which will alter the way they face the next moment, the next day, the rest of their life....It meets people where they are, and brings them right on to the point where they are strong enough to see new hope, new possibilities, new ways forward."

I wonder...

Collect


God of compassion, whose Son Jesus Christ, the child of Mary, shared the life of a home in Nazareth, and on the cross drew the whole human family to himself: strengthen us in our daily living that in joy and in sorrow we may know the power of your presence to bind together and to heal; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

First Reading: 2 Corinthians 1.3-7

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and the God of all consolation, who consoles us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to console those who are in any affliction with the consolation with which we ourselves are consoled by God. For just as the sufferings of Christ are abundant for us, so also our consolation is abundant through Christ. If we are being afflicted, it is for your consolation and salvation; if we are being consoled, it is for your consolation, which you experience when you patiently endure the same sufferings that we are also suffering. Our hope for you is unshaken; for we know that as you share in our sufferings, so also you share in our consolation.

Gospel: Luke 2.33-35

The child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about Jesus. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed - and a sword will pierce your own soul too.'

CHURCH OPEN DURING THE DAY Please note that the Church remains open for personal prayer during this time.

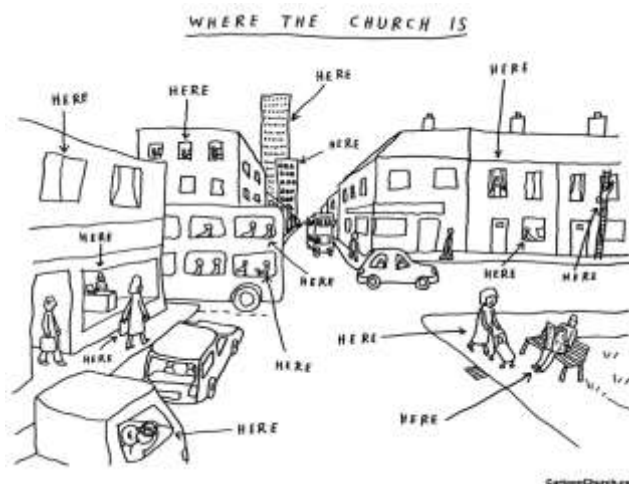
